

5 resourcing

There is a School Resourcing Standard (SRS) which describes the nationally agreed minimum level that schools need to be funded at to meet the needs of all students. This is a combined measure of both state and federal funding levels.

Despite the challenges of working in an underfunded system, public school teachers continue to work in the interests of their students and their communities.

Successful people usually give credit to their education. Public school educated achievers have more to boast of because likely that they broke more barriers to get to where they are.

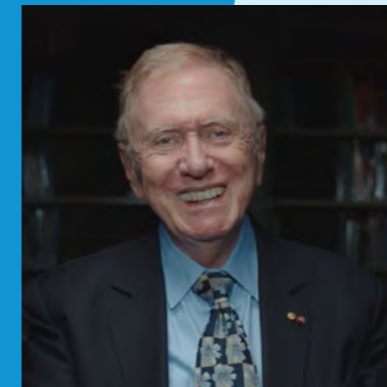

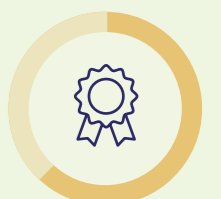

“ But if you’re only interested in academic achievement, the results from most of the 30-odd Australian studies since 2000 suggest that **private schools are no better at progressing students’ learning than state schools**, once you’ve controlled for socioeconomic background. That’s also been the case for Australia’s results in the past three PISA tests, the OECD’s international comparison test for student learning.”

“On average private schools superficially appear to achieve higher student outcomes,” concedes education researcher and public schools advocate Trevor Cobbold. “But public schools enrol the vast majority of disadvantaged students ... and this is what largely accounts for differences in school outcomes.”

Public schools embrace everyone.

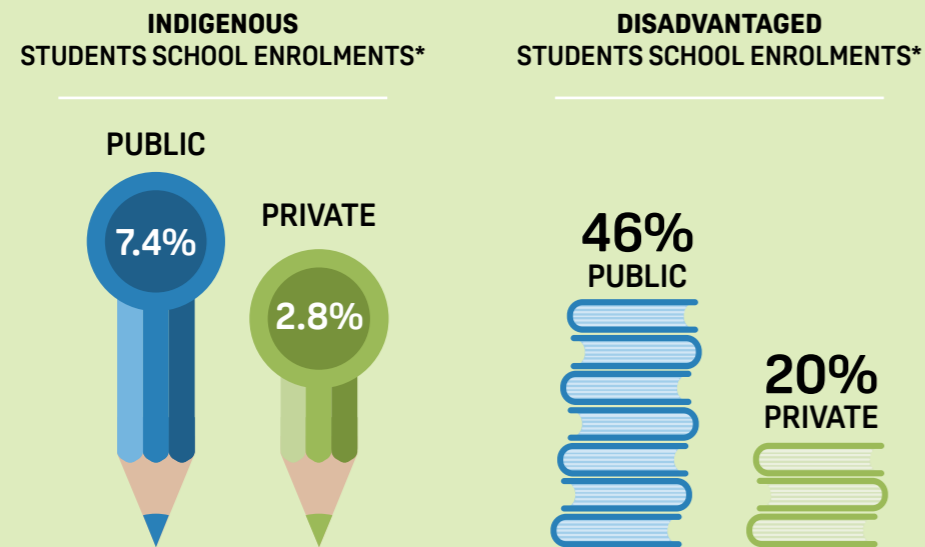


The recent study showed NAPLAN scores of children who attended private schools were no different to those in public schools, after accounting for socioeconomic background.

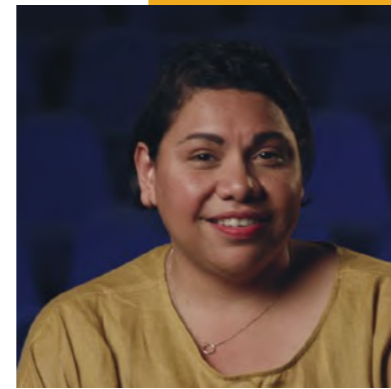

Because public schools admit all children in the community, those that attend the schools are more likely to be in classrooms with other children that do and don’t think, act or look exactly like them. **Students are more apt to be exposed to students from different cultures or income levels.** They may learn to work with other students with mental and physical disabilities. The diversity of the student body can be an important learning experience in itself for all of the children that attend a particular school.

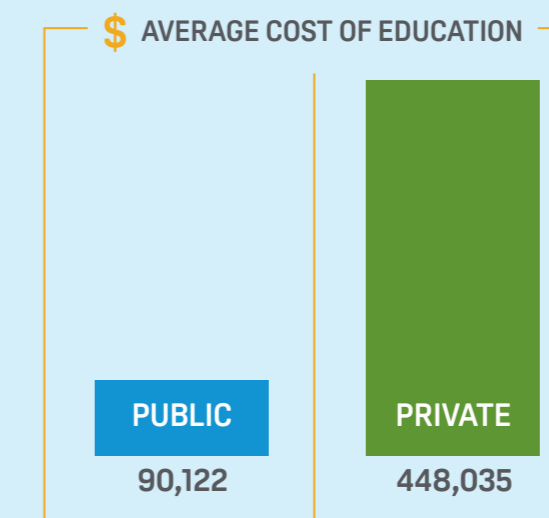
access to educational opportunities. Because education is seen as the great equalizer for society, the availability of education is a key mandate.

The value of a public education cannot be beaten.



Research reveals that Sydney parents with a child starting at a private school in 2021 will expend an average of \$448,035 over the course of their education. While students off to a Sydney public school in 2021 are predicted to pay \$90,122 over the cost of their school years.

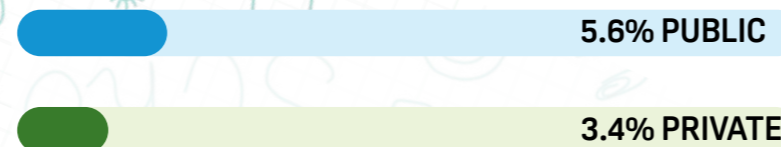

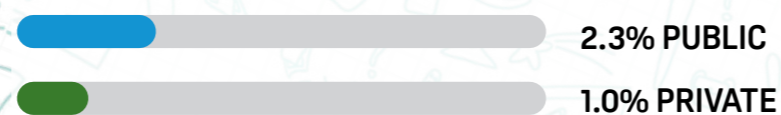

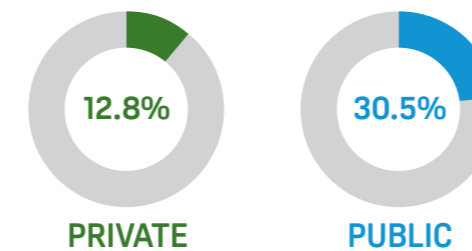
HIGH DISABILITY (EXTENSIVE & SUBSTANTIAL) STUDENTS SCHOOL ENROLMENTS*
