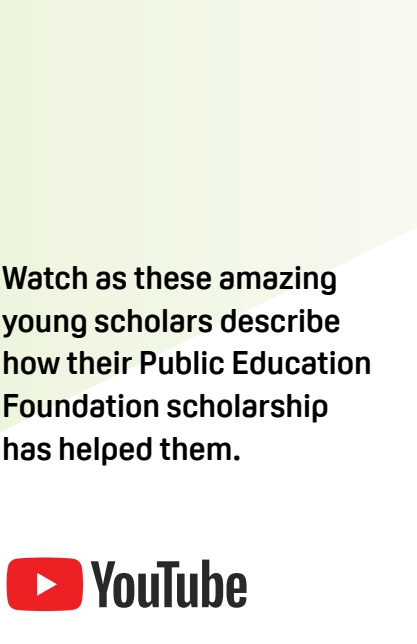

The Public Education Foundation is a not-for-profit organisation dedicated to providing life-changing scholarships to young people in public education and enhancing the value and reputation of public schools across Australia.

The Foundation achieves this by pursuing the following goals:

- To provide scholarships for students and teachers in public schools
- To provide funding for enhanced educational opportunities, outside of the normal core provision of public education, for public education students, but especially for students with a particular education need
- To conduct educational programs and provide educational opportunities supplementary to the core services of public education for the benefit of students with a particular educational need and to fund programs of professional development for teachers
- To raise funds for the support of public educational programs additional to the core provision of public education and to conduct business on its own account through such activities as from time to time authorised by the Board
- To undertake research in the field of education and publish results
- To do all such acts, matters and things including the funding of scholarships, training and the like whether in Australia or elsewhere and to enter into and make such agreements as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of any purposes of the Company whether as agent or otherwise.

Report from the Chair and Chief Executive Officer

It is our distinct pleasure to present the 2021-22 Annual Report of the Public Education Foundation.

The last year was one that tried and tested all of us more than we had anticipated. The year began with great hope that the COVID-19 pandemic was over and it was with delight that we saw school students across the country returning to classrooms. However, the reality was much more nuanced. It demanded improvisation, creativity and innovation as we adapted to changing needs of our scholars and the reality of significant disruption in all fields including education.

Our top priority has remained the wellbeing and educational continuity of our scholars. For the first time, we undertook a dedicated fundraising drive for laptops, enabling us to provide hundreds of refurbished laptops for disadvantaged students across Australia.

The disruption post-pandemic affected the ability of schools to support scholarship applications, leading to fewer applications than in the prior year. Despite this, we still had many more applications than available scholarships and were again able to deliver record growth in our scholarship program. In total, we distributed \$1,547,774 in scholarships to 917 students and 5 educators across 8 states and territories.

There were a number of important milestones for the Foundation across the year, including:

- New scholarships for nursing and midwifery students funded by the NSW Nurses & Midwives Association and Nurses & Midwives Health;
- New scholarships for Victorian primary school students funded by the Phillips Brothers Foundation;

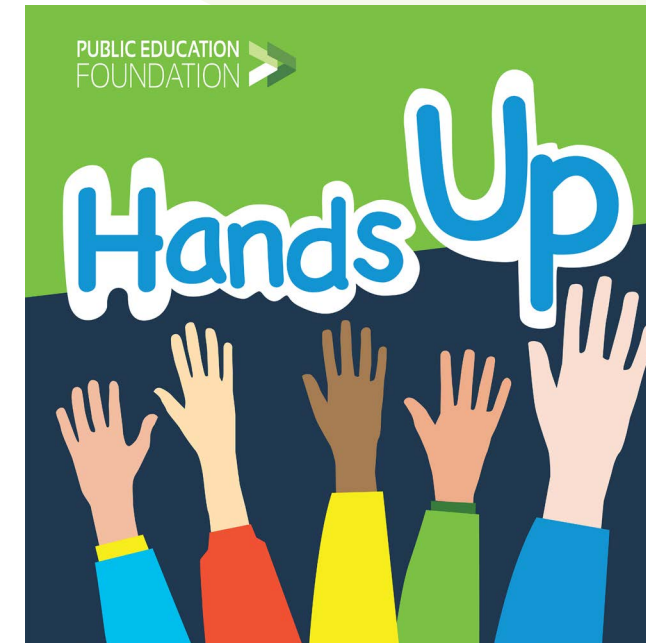
- New Acacia Program scholarships in ACT, NSW, QLD, VIC and WA;
- New Manifold Road creative scholarships for Western Sydney students; and
- An advocacy toolkit summarising key facts and benefits of public education for teachers, principals, parents and carers.

One particular highlight was hosting our Proudly Public Annual Awards in full for the first time in three years. Sydney Town Hall came to life in an explosion of colour and song as we celebrated our 2022 scholars, and the audience heard from the inspirational Yalda Hakim – Afghan refugee, BBC World anchor and proud graduate of Australian public schools.

Finally, we wish to offer heartfelt thanks to all those donors, volunteers and organisational partners who make possible our support for students and teachers in public education – your generosity is remarkable. Just as importantly, the staff and board at the Foundation work incredibly hard to change students' lives, and our enduring gratitude goes to all of them.

It is with pride and sadness that we report this will be David Hetherington's final Annual Report as our CEO. Over the last six years, David has led the organisation through a period of transformational growth.

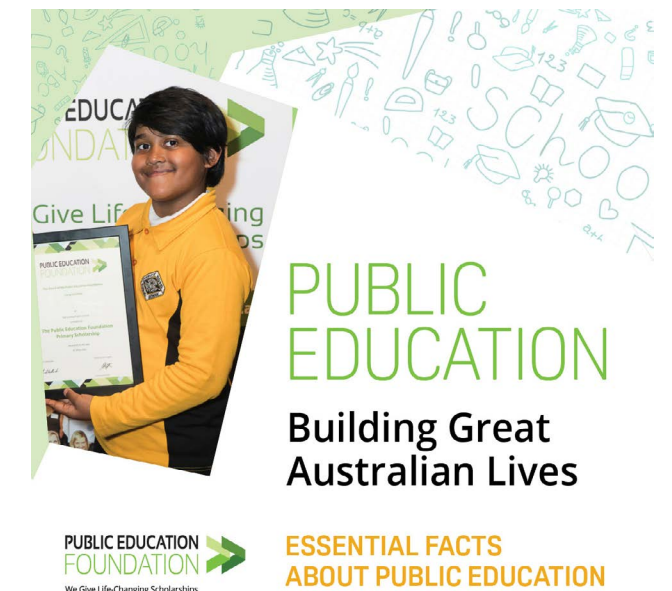
On his arrival in 2016, David joined an organisation that delivered \$392,000 in scholarships to around 180 recipients. This year, PEF has distributed over \$1.5m in scholarships to over 900 public education students, not to mention an increase in awards to principals and teachers. The Foundation now delivers scholarships in every state and territory and has expanded its scholarship offering to include laptops, tutoring and mentoring.

Survey and feedback data commissioned by PEF indicates that our scholars and the schools they represent get a demonstrable uplift from our work. David has played a key role in that.

David also developed a comprehensive advocacy program for the Foundation, with our *Building Great Australian Lives* series and our *Hands Up* podcast showcasing the best of public education. David will be greatly missed as head of the organisation and we wish him all the very best in his future endeavours. However, we do hope that we can convince him to stay connected in one role or another.

Story of a Scholar

Michelle Ung

Recipient of the Agnes Borsody Scholarship (2020-2021) and the Public Education Foundation Tertiary Scholarship (2022-2024)

The Foundation's tagline is "We give life-changing scholarships" and Michelle's story is a great example of this aspiration. As a child of Cambodian refugees, Michelle might not have been expected to top the state in an English course. In fact, she placed first in English Advanced during the 2021 HSC exams and in doing so made her parents extremely proud. We share below some responses from Michelle in relation to this fine achievement.

How did the scholarship and mentoring program enable you to succeed during high school?

The PEF scholarship supported me greatly throughout my senior years of high school. The funding from the scholarship provided me with immense monetary support that enabled me to afford my education during the final two years of my secondary schooling. I was able to purchase my first laptop due to the scholarship's extensive support! Thanks to PEF's scholarship, I was able to achieve great academic success in year 12. Specifically, I have received state rankings in English Advanced and Extension 1. I can't thank the Foundation enough for their abundant guidance and support!

PEF's Mentoring Program helped me greatly in navigating both academic and personal struggles (especially due to the impact of COVID-19). I was so glad to have met such a wonderful mentor who celebrated my every win and helped me push through tough times! I still meet up with my PEF mentor every month (finally, now

regularly in-person!) to discuss the highs and lows of my month and draw on her valuable professional and life advice. I couldn't be more grateful for this wonderful scholarship and the boundless opportunities it has presented me!

How has the Public Education Foundation Tertiary Scholarship enabled you during your university studies?

I'm very grateful for the tertiary scholarship granted to me following my graduation in 2021. It has helped me immensely in not only affording my daily expenses (namely, public transport, food and electricity expenses) but also those of my family who struggle to afford everyday living. It has made me feel like I belong at the University of Sydney, a university in which students are often from higher socioeconomic backgrounds. I can now afford to be actively involved in extracurricular activities, which build my character and sense of community in a foreign environment.

What was your family's reaction when you first received a scholarship from PEF?

My family was ecstatic when I received the scholarship. I remember them saying how proud they were of me, and how it was the starting point to my future academic successes. Funnily enough, it turned out to be true!



What are you currently working on, both within university and the broader community?

I am currently studying a Combined Bachelor of Commerce and Law at the University of Sydney. Alongside university, I am an active representative of the Fairfield Youth Advisory Committee, where I plan and initiate events for social issues, such as mental health and youth unemployment, in my local area. I also currently work as a paralegal at a law firm in Parramatta in hopes of pursuing a career in commercial law.

What are your plans for the years ahead?

My plans for the next few years are to complete my degree and in doing so try as many new things as possible in addition to meeting as many new people as I can! I was recently elected as a representative of the Students' Representative Council at the University of Sydney, where I play an active role in dealing with student housing. During my time on the council, I've enjoyed working alongside the close-knit team to make possible changes which have benefitted socioeconomically disadvantaged and ethnically diverse students. I plan to continue making great strides across my university studies, leadership opportunities and career path, exposing myself to as many different experiences as possible.

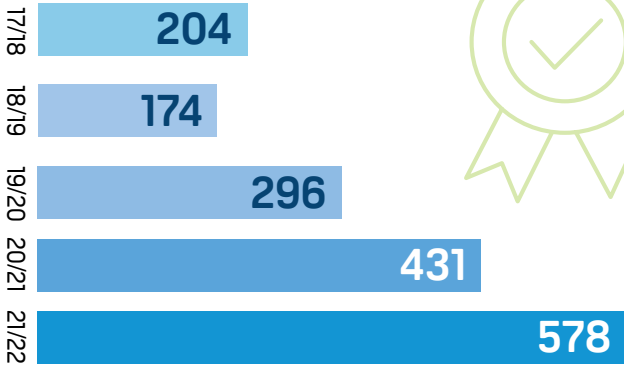

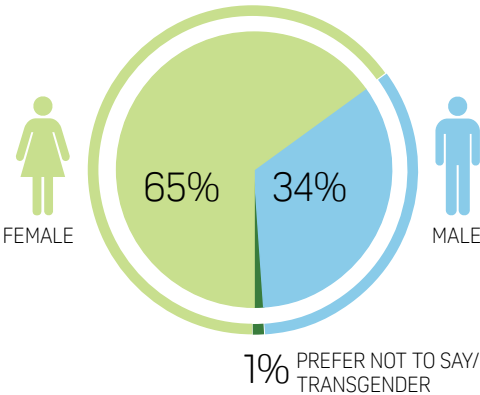

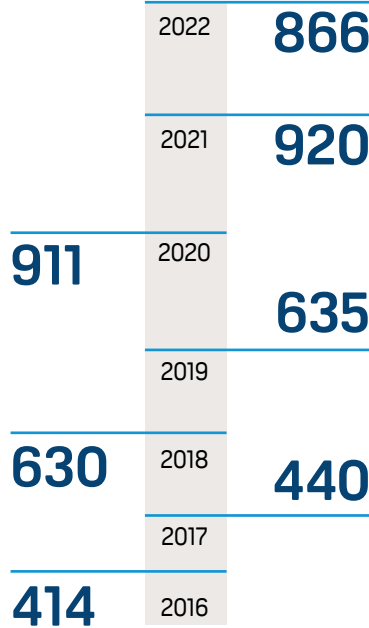

APPLICATION NUMBERS ACROSS AUSTRALIA

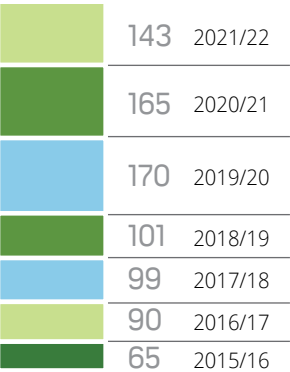
