

EMORGO SCHOLARSHIP FOR MUSIC

The Public Education Foundation's Emorgo Scholarship for Music assists a talented musician commencing at the Conservatorium High School. The scholarship is offered to a student entering Year 7 at the Conservatorium High School as a member of the Junior Vocal Stream or as an instrumentalist majoring in the study of a woodwind instrument **or existing Conservatorium High School students currently in Year 7, 8 or 9 who are majoring in woodwind or the French Horn.**

The Emorgo Scholarship for Music will provide a payment of \$5,000 to assist with expenses related to musical studies and education expenses.

The scholarship is to cover musical and educational expenses such as:

- Purchase of a musical instrument relevant to their musical studies
- Musical tuition
- Uniforms and other equipment
- Stationery and books
- Laptop
- Course or study related software
- Printer
- Excursions and camps

The student must remain enrolled as a student at the Conservatorium High School's Junior Vocal Stream or continue to pursue the study of a woodwind instrument at the Conservatorium High School for the duration of the scholarship.

If a student leaves the Conservatorium High School during the scholarship period, the scholarship will lapse. Any unspent monies at the end of the scholarship period must be refunded to the Public Education Foundation scholarship fund.

Basic Eligibility

- Currently in Year 6 (in 2026) and has applied to commence Year 7 at the Conservatorium High School in 2027 **OR** an existing the Conservatorium High School student in Years 7, 8 or 9 in 2027, majoring in woodwind or the French Horn

- Australian citizen or permanent resident

Selection Criteria

- Potential to do well at school and be able to demonstrate that the scholarship will make a significant contribution to reaching their musical ambitions
- Assessment of all round musical potential based on the audition and assessment process of the Conservatorium High School
- Commitment to the study of a woodwind instrument and / or vocal performance in the school's Junior Vocal Stream

Selection Process

A selection panel will review all scholarship applications and assess them against the selection criteria. The selection panel will include representatives of the Public Education Foundation, a representative from the Conservatorium High School, and independent experts. After considering all applications, the selection panel will recommend the selected applicant for the approval of the Public Education Foundation's Board. Successful applicants will be notified in December 2026.

Applicants will be notified of the outcome via email. If successful, the scholarship recipient's school will receive a notification.

How To Apply

All applications for the Emorgo Scholarship for Music, applications must be submitted via the Foundation's online portal. Please note that all you will need to sign up for a [PEF-Apply](#) account to access the form.

Note – ALL sections of the application, INCLUDING the Principals Supporting Statement must be completed before the application can be submitted.

Applicants should select the *Conservatorium High School Music Scholarships*

Prior to starting your application, you should compile the following information ready to submit:

- Applicant details including:
 - full name
 - gender
 - date of birth
 - phone number
 - address
 - email (***please ensure you nominate an email account you regularly access***)
- Residence status (copy of residency Visa or Citizenship certificate is a requirement for applicants born outside of Australia)
- Parent/guardian details (at least one but up to two)
 - name
 - phone number
 - relationship to student

- o email (***please ensure you nominate an email account you regularly access***)
- School details:
 - o name of school
 - o address
 - o principal name
 - o email
- School Point of Contact – the person at the school who you would like correspondence sent to – name, phone number and email
- Basic information about you / your family:
 - o whether you are Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander, or Pacific or South Sea Islander
 - o your mob/family/traditional owner/language group
 - o if you are from a Non-English-Speaking Background
 - o country of origin of your parents and yourself
 - o which languages you speak and are spoken at home
 - o how many adults live on your home
 - o how many of those adults are working
 - o who is the primary caregiver at home
 - o how many other school aged (or younger) children live in your house
 - o highest education qualification of your immediate family
 - o if you have a diagnosed disability or learning difficulty
 - o whether you have been in out-of-home care
 - o socio-economic background
 - o how you found out about the scholarship
- Which instrument/s you play
- A statement outlining why you are a suitable candidate for this scholarship and how you meet each of the selection criteria. Please also include details of your musical goals. (Maximum 400 words)
- A copy of all pages of your most recent school report ready to upload
- A reference from your Music Teacher (PDF or Word format, maximum 400 words)
Please advise your referee that our Panels are not in a position to contact them for additional information. The reference should provide all information they feel is relevant.
- A supporting statement from your Principal which addresses the selection criteria (the applicant must initiate a request ***via the online application*** to the Principal. This will result in an email being sent to the Principal asking them to ***complete a statement of support online***) ***This statement must be completed by your Principal before the application can be submitted.***

APPLICANTS PLEASE NOTE – the Principal statement must be from your CURRENT Principal, NOT the Conservatorium High School Principal UNLESS you are a current Conservatorium High School student

Note for Principals: Please be aware that your statement is a critical component of the application form and your feedback is given considerable weight in the process of panel deliberations. The

panels are looking for feedback that goes well beyond simple confirmation that the student is enrolled in your school, or that you endorse the application. Generic responses, or copy/paste responses from the applicants or referees' statements **WILL** disadvantage the applicant.

Submitting Your Application

Once you have finalised your application and all elements are complete (including references as required), you can submit it for review.

Applications must be submitted by 5pm on Friday 25th September 2026.
